With unprecedented access to the inner workings of the police service it's an illuminating, if tough-going look at how a missing person's case turned into a murder investigation.

# Who is Natalie Hemming?

Natalie Hemming was a car salesperson and mum of three from Milton Keynes. Last year Hemming was reported missing leading to a massive police search which went on for three weeks before she was found beaten to death in a wooded area of Hertfordshire.

Hemming's ex-partner Paul was convicted of her murder and sentenced to a minimum term of 20-years in prison.
