Sophie, 12, Fabian, 11, and threeyear-old Chloe are redoubtable, remarkable, happy children. All three live substantial parts of their lives in hospital undergoing gruelling treatment for highly aggressive cancers.

This is a piercingly sad film, but the children are marvels as they take part in pioneering drug and cell therapy at Great Ormond Street Hospital. Eight-year-old James, solemn and wise beyond his years, is Chloe's brother and is fully aware of his sister's condition: "My dad told me last night that, as children's cancer goes, it doesn't get much worse than what Chloe's got."
