Thief Trackers

DAYTIME CHOICE Two bicycles are stolen in London. Not unusual, and most of us would glumly assume that that's the last we'd ever see of them. But it's possible to find out where they've gone by using tracking technology. In this case they end up in the East End of London, where one is sold on.

This series, which started on Monday, tells the story of what becomes of stolen laptops, mobiles, bicycles and DVD players (and even more unusual items, such as ornaments from a grave). Some are stolen to order and exported overseas; others are sold online to innocent members of the public, or to shops, where they're often bought in good faith. **JANE RACKHAM**

DOCUMENTARY What's it like to be an ordinary Muslim in Britain? Robb Leech, who made *My Brother the Islamist* and *My Brother the Terrorist* for BBC3, turned his hand-held camera on the East London Mosque around the time, coincidentally, that three London schoolgirls ran away to Syria to become jihadi brides.

He gets remarkable access, and is honest about his misgivings on issues such as male and female segregation, but the mosque clearly isn't the hotbed of extremism some inflammatory newspaper articles have suggested. As one youngster says, "Isis are barbaric... they go against all the qualities of Islam..." **JR**

Doctor Foster

DRAMA What a charming bunch the people of pretty Parminster are, denouncing their supposedly adored doctor, Gemma Foster, online and anonymously. You suspect her community turning on her hurts more than her husband's affair.

It seems poor Gemma (Suranne Jones) doesn't have a friend in the world, not even that passive-aggressive sneak she works with, Ros (Thusitha Jayasundera), who gets a bit holy when someone makes a serious allegation against Gemma.

It's a weird episode, coming over all Jane Campion at one point, but

the writing (by creator Mike Bartlett) and acting, particularly by Jones and Bertie Carvel as her rotten husband, Simon, grip hard and fast. **AG**

Midwinter of the Spirit

DRAMA This is such a delightfully rich stew – there's a thunderstorm, actual bumps in the night, demonic possession, a sacrificial crow and much, much worse. Who knew pretty, peaceful Herefordshire hid such depraved depths? At the forefront is plucky exorcist the Rev Merrily Watkins (Anna Maxwell Martin), fortified by wine and endless fags. She has seen two deaths that she suspects were murders and she can't shake off the feeling that she's been infected by the reeking soul of the ghastly man she comforted on his deathbed.

It's great fun and outrageously melodramatic, but the admirable Maxwell Martin and David Threlfall ("God help you, Merrily!") give it all they've got. **AG**

Dark Side of the Greens

DOCUMENTARY For Mark Twain, golf was a good walk ruined. For many today, golf is ruinous to nature. In a follow-up to his excellent *You've Been Trumped* – about Donald Trump's plans to build a luxury golf resort in Aberdeenshire – Anthony Baxter also looks at the campaign to stop a resort in Dubrovnik.

It's another sobering David v Goliath story, with Robert Kennedy Jr claiming, "Wherever there's large-scale environment destruction, there's a subversion of democracy."

But as Anna Hall's superb film following Greater Manchester Police shows, enforcing that enlightened law is hard. We meet South Asian women who have fled their homes after receiving threats to their life, but the victims rarely give statements. Roksana fled her father's threats of violence; in a chilling police interview, he protests that *of course* he wouldn't hurt her because, "You can hit your wife, you can hit your son but [not] daughters – I don't know why you can't. That's our weakness." **DB**

COMEDY DRAMA New series Broadcasters routinely claim their offerings are "bold" and "ambitious". This new series is all of that, done on a scale that feels almost unBritish. Mathew Baynton (of BBC2's *The Wrong Mans*) plays another Berkshire everyman.

He's Jamie, a mournful Slough bank clerk who is baffled when the police arrest him for international cyber-crime.

His arrest happens on the very day a comet is discovered to be hurtling towards Earth. As well as Jamie, we follow what the end of the world might mean for an Oklahoma librarian arriving in prison and an Italian nun applying for a post at the Vatican, where her boss is a rogue priest played by Rob Lowe.

Add Megan Mullally (from *Will & Grace*) as a white supremacist and Pauline Quirke as Jamie's mum and you've got a heck of an ensemble cast. **DB**
